Good Fit for Distribution?

How can you tell if a program you are looking at is good for distribution credits abroad?

We will list top examples for spring/summer, but good general clues are:

- A program with "university study" or "humanities and social sciences" in the title – likely to have broad coursework opportunities with distribution classes
- Upon looking at the coursework, the course aligns with the **LSA distribution area definitions**

- By LSA definition, distributioneligible courses are:
 - Broad in scope, rather than narrowly focused
 - Accessible to students with no background in the subject
 - Introductory in nature rather than a specialized upper-level course

London School of Economics Summer School



The Basics

- Location: London, England
- Terms: Sp, Su, Sp/Su
- **Provider:** IFSA-Butler
 - Apply on <u>M-Compass</u> and <u>IFSA portal</u>
- Academics:
 - Sessions 3 in total, students can select a single session or combinations of multiple
 - Each session is 3 weeks long and students take a single 3 credit course
 - Must enroll in at least 2 sessions to be eligible for financial aid
- Housing: Guaranteed by Provider
 - Either LSE residence halls or IFSA-provided flats
 - All are self-catered

 - Gender and Sexuality in Dutch Literature from 1700 to the Present
 - Sex and Sciences: Dutch Medicine and Intersexuality
 - Introduction to the Study of Sexuality and Gender in the Context of Amsterdam

- Session 1 May Term: 3 credits
- Session 2 June Term: 3 or 6 credits
- Session 3 July Term: 3 or 6 credits
 - You can do a combination of terms
 - You need at least 6 credits to be considered for FinAid
- Housing:
 - Shared apartments, student dorms, or homestay options are available

Summer Study in Athens or the Greek Isles



The Basics

- **Location:** Athens & Greek Islands *(depends on course)*
- Provider: College Year Athens
 - Apply on M-Compass and CYA portal
- Academics:
 - Two consecutive 4-week Sessions
 - One course per 4-week session
 - Each course has different excursion destinations throughout the Greek Isles
 - Courses require some hours of outdoor walking in typically hot temperatures (80+)
- Housing: Shared Apartments in Athens, Hotels and/or Hostels during excursions/trips

Summer Study in Denmark & Sweden*



The Basics

- Location: Copenhagen, Denmark AND/OR Stockholm, Sweden
- Provider: DIS Study Abroad in Scandinavia
 - Apply on M-Compass and DIS's portal
- FAQ: Program FAQ
- Academics:
 - 1 course per 3-week session (up to 3 sessions)
 - Courses are selected when applying
 - <u>Summer course guide</u>
 - Students can do 6-week lab or research sessions instead, research is highly competitive
- Housing: Apartment/dorm style housing
- Advisor: Callie

University of Westminster Summer School



The Basics

- Location: London, England
- Terms: Sp, Su, Sp/Su
- Provider: IFSA-Butler
 - Apply on <u>M-Compass</u> and <u>IFSA portal</u>
- Academics:
 - Sessions 2 in total, students can do just one or both
 - Each session is 4 weeks long and students take a single 4 credit course
 - Must enroll in both sessions to be eligible for financial aid
- Housing: Guaranteed by Provider
 - Either Westminster residence halls or IFSA-provided flats
 - All are self-catered
- Advisor: Ellyse Vogel (ellysev@umich.edu)

Yonsei International Summer School in Seoul



The Basics

- Location: Yonsei University, Seoul, South Korea
- Term: Summer
- Provider: Yonsei University
 - Apply on <u>M-Compass</u> and complete a YISS application after nomination
- Academics: 6-9 credits
 - Can choose amongst the following: <u>YISS Courses</u> (Computer science, data science, and AI courses are very limited/highly competitive)
 - Research internships available (2 credits)
- Housing: Single room / Double room (meal plans not offered)
- Advisor: Joy

Course Approvals

- Start conversations with your advisors about study abroad *early*!
 - They can help you decide what requirements you can complete abroad and what must be done on campus
- LSA students receive in-residence credit on their transcript no matter what
 - Classes taken abroad automatically apply toward GPA
 - Students have the option to take courses pass/fail
- Major/minor classes
 - Consult major/minor departments and check for pre-approvals on the <u>By Major pages</u>
- Distribution classes
 - Consult academic advisor
- Narrow your choices down, find syllabi, and set up an appointment!



Multiple Application Policy

CGIS only permits students to apply to a 2nd program if the top choice program is competitive. Students must rank their applications or no applications will be reviewed.

- **Competitive programs** are only reviewed if they are ranked 1st.
 - If you wish to apply to two programs, you must rank the competitive program 1st and the backup program 2nd.
 - You will need to complete a questionnaire in your M-Compass application to rank your choices.

- If you are interested in two competitive programs, you must only select one to apply to. If you apply to both, only the first ranked will be reviewed.
- If you are interested in two non-competitive programs, you must only select one to apply to. If you apply to both, only the first ranked will be reviewed.

Financial Aid

Consult the Office of Financial Aid Study Abroad Team (finaid.abroad@umich.edu) about how studying abroad could impact your eligibility for financial aid and how much you'd be eligible for.

- Minimum of 6 credits for spring/summer programs
- A variety of funding sources are available to help CGIS students cover program-related expenses
 - Eligibility depends on your program and your unique financial situation

LSA Study Abroad Scholarships



Did you know? 95% of eligible LSA Students receive between \$1,000 and \$10,000 depending on program costs and financial need
