The Basics

- Location: Granada, Spain
- Winter semester only, with U-M Faculty
- Provider: <u>IES</u> (customized program)
- Academics: 16 credits
- Housing: Homestay or Residence Hall
- Instruction in Spanish only
- Local university enrollment OR internship

Winter 2025 Courses (3 credits each, 400-level literature courses)

- The Spanish Civil War and its Legacies
- Conditions of Crisis in Contemporary Mexico

Advanced Language and Culture in Granada

- Spanish language class at the appropriate level (required; 4 credits)
- U-M Faculty-led course (at least one required; 3 credits each)
- IES Area Study courses (one required; 3 credits each)
 - Explore and better understand Spanish language, history, and culture

- Local immersion course (required):
 - <u>University of Granada</u> courses (3 credits each), <u>OR</u>
 - Internship placement and seminar (3 credits)

Advanced Language and Culture in Madrid

The Basics

- Location: Madrid, Spain
- Fall | Winter | Academic Year
- Provider: <u>IES</u>
 - The IES Abroad application (Part 1 and Part 2) must be in by the CGIS deadline.
- Academics: 16 credits (5 courses)
 - IES Spanish language course (required; 4 credits)
 - <u>IES Areas Study courses</u> (at least two-three required;
 3 credits each)
 - Local immersion course (required; 3 credits each):
 <u>Universidad Complutense de Madrid</u> or IES internship (plus seminar)
- Housing: Apartment, Residence, Homestay
- Instruction in Spanish only

Advanced Spanish Language in Buenos Aires

The Basics

- Location: Buenos Aires, Argentina
- Fall | Winter
- Provider: <u>IFSA-Butler</u>
- Academics: 15-18 credits
- Course requirements:
 - IFSA-Butler (at least one required; 3 credits)
 - Local universities (USAL, UTDT, UBA; at least one required; credits vary per university)
- Housing: Homestay and apartment
- Instruction in Spanish only
- Internships and experiential learning available (optional)
- Program dates: Late July Mid-December (Fall term) and Late February - Early July (Winter term)

Liberal Arts in Santiago de Chile

The Basics

- Location: Santiago, Chile
- Fall | Winter
- Provider: <u>CIEE</u>
- Academics: 15-18 credits
- Required courses:
 - One CIEE elective course (required; 3 credits)
 - At least one direct-enroll courses at host universities (Universidad de Chile, Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile, and Universidad Diego Portales)
- Housing: Homestay and residence hall
- Instruction in Spanish only
- Internships and community service available (optional)

Courses (examples from past years)

- Anthropology of Violence
- Chilean Cinema: Vision of History
- Mapuche Art, Culture and Aesthetics
- Political and Economic Development of Latin America

Applications due on **September 15th!**



RLL Course Credit and Advising

- With careful planning, students can complete half of the Spanish major in one semester abroad. In addition, students can complete most of the minor requirements (5 out of 7 courses) while abroad.
- Spanish majors and minors must meet with a Spanish faculty advisor before and after going abroad.
- Earn credit towards distribution and/or other majors/minors with pre-approval.
