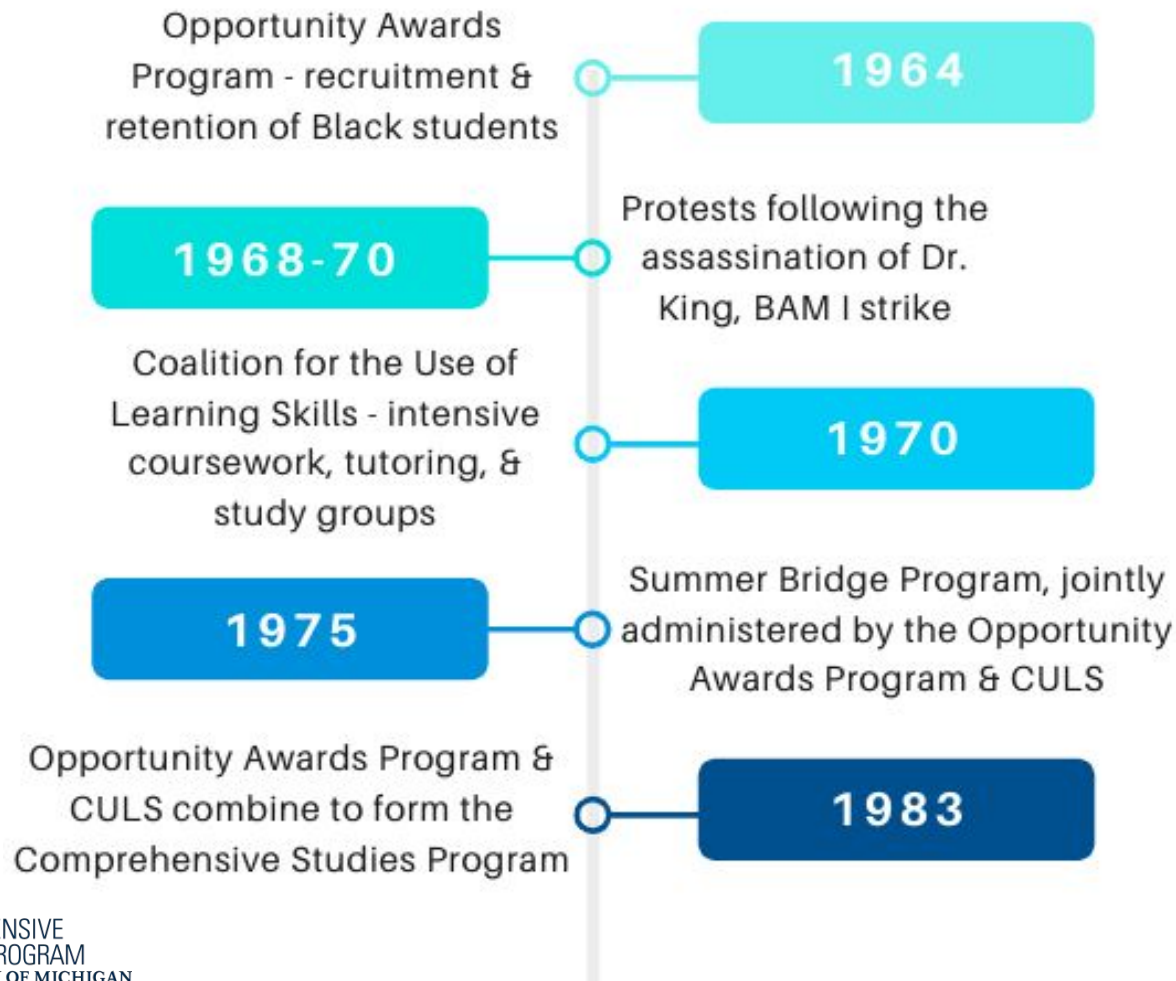

What is Summer

Administered by CSP, the Summer Bridge Scholars Program (SBSP) is a 7-week residential, academic program that bridges the gaps in opportunity created by inequitable systems in education. We give scholars a competitive edge as they enter the fall by providing scholars with an opportunity to...

- build a sense of belonging and confidence in their ability to navigate the U-M community
- develop a strong and sustainable network of peers, staff and faculty at U-M
- complete a total of 6 credits in academic coursework
- connect with and utilize university resources across campus



Important Dates

- **Move-in** - Saturday, June 24
- **Orientation** - Saturday, June 24-Tuesday, June 27
- **Scholars register for summer classes** - Tuesday, June 27
- **First day of class** - Wednesday, June 28
- **Adventure Leadership** - Friday, July 7, Saturday, July 8, or Sunday, July 9
- **Scholars register for fall classes** - Begins June 29
- **Wellness Conference** - Saturday, July 22
- **Closing Ceremony** - Tuesday, August 15
- **Last day of class** - Tuesday, August 15
- **End of semester** - Friday, August 17

What to do before arrival

- ★ Submit your final high school transcript with graduation date and final grades to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions
 - The transcript must include a graduation date
- ★ Request official AP or IB exam results to be sent to U-M to receive credit
 - Scores must be sent directly from the testing agency

What to do before arrival

- ★ Virtual Orientation Course and U-M Placement Exams
 - Search “Your 2023 Orientation Information” in your U-M email account
- ★ Submit your Covid-19 vaccination info or request an exemption
 - This should be done ASAP at vaxviewer.umich.edu
- ★ Sign your housing contract
 - You won’t receive this until your vaccination or exemption is approved

What to do before arrival

- ★ Check your U-M email account regularly
 - Prior to SBSP: at least twice a week
 - Once SBSP begins: at least twice a day
- ★ Take your M-Card photo
 - This is your school ID and submitting your photo online will speed up your check-in process on move-in day
- ★ Print and sign necessary forms for move-in
 - Forms will be sent the week of June 12 to your U-M email

What to do before arrival

- ★ Begin to access your Wolverine Access account
 - [Wolverineaccess.umich.edu](https://wolverineaccess.umich.edu) > Student Business
 - This is where you can see your financial aid package
 - Sign up for Direct Deposit to receive your financial aid funds more quickly
- ★ Start following our Instagram account @umichbridge!

FAQs

- When is tuition due?
 - **June 30**
 - IMPORTANT NOTE: Your financial aid package cannot be applied until you have enrolled in courses on June 27 so you will not see it applied to your account until **June 28**.

FAQs

- Do I need to sign up for orientation?
 - **No**, you are automatically signed up through Summer Bridge. You should still complete the Virtual Orientation Course and the U-M Placement Exams at least one week before move-in.
- Do I enroll for classes before I arrive?
 - **No**, you'll work with your academic advisor to get registered for both summer and fall term courses in your first week.

FAQs

- What time is move-in?
 - Move in will take place from 8am-2pm on Saturday, June 24.
 - We will assign you a time range next week via email.
- When will I find out my roommate?
 - Due to the quick turnaround for housing, it's possible you may not find out who your roommate is until move-in day.

FAQs

- Will I have to move between summer and fall term?
 - **Most likely, yes.** The vast majority of scholars will not remain in East Quad.
 - Housing has arranged for those who plan to live in the residence halls in the fall to be able to move-out on Saturday, August 18 and move-in directly to their academic year residence hall. More info will come via email this summer.
