
Toward an Open Monograph Ecosystem

an initiative to support humanistic scholarship

The University of Michigan is a charter participant in a subvention-funded digital monograph publishing initiative developed by a group of respected research universities in the United States. Formerly known as the Open Access Monograph Publishing Initiative (OAMPI) and now called TOME, this project promotes the wide digital dissemination of humanities scholarship by providing academic publishers sufficient funds to produce and make available an open access version of long-form scholarly works. Through our participation in this effort, the University of Michigan seeks to increase academic and public engagement with humanities scholarship produced by our faculty.

Who is eligible?

Instructional and Research Faculty of all ranks, Librarians, Curators, and Archivists (as defined by the University Bylaws, Section 5.01) may apply. While funded through LSA, faculty authors of humanities and humanistic social science books from across the U-M system are eligible. Research Investigators, Research Fellows, Lecturers, and students are not currently eligible.

No financial contribution is required from the faculty member or the department.

Who reviews my application?

A panel including faculty representation from LSA, the Institute for the Humanities, and the University Library will review proposals and provide recommendations. Funding decisions will be made by the Associate Dean for the Humanities in LSA.

What do I need to apply?

A signed contract between author and publisher is required to release funds, and only publishers that provide a high standard of peer-review are eligible. In consultation with your publisher, you must also provide a proposal narrative, a letter of interest from the publisher, and a budget detailing how funds will be used. LSA faculty must apply through the Gateway to Internal Funding (eGIF); all others must submit their proposals to LSAResearchOffice@umich.edu.
