## **Peer Critiques Handout**

Write out a full outline of the essay's <b>main points</b> , skipping the introduction and conclusion.
What do you see as the essay's main <b>topic</b> (What do all the above paragraphs have in common, subject-wise)?
What do you see as the essay's main <b>thesis</b> (how do all the paragraphs compare, contrast and come together to form an argument)?

<b>Does this interpretation agree with the author's stated thesis?</b> In what ways might the paper need to change so that its structure more effectively supports the thesis?
Where is more <b>evidence</b> needed?
Where are more interpretations needed?
Where do more <b>connections or explicit contrasts</b> need to be made between points?
Does the essay <b>open</b> in an appealing, purposeful way? How else might the essay begin, to better capture and direct our attention?
Does the essay draw a thought-provoking conclusion that puts its argument in a larger context? What else might the conclusion explore?
