Overview



A graduate certificate in the exciting and fast-growing interdisciplinary field of Cognitive Science can be earned by completing **12 credits selected from among five disciplinary course groups of contemporary inquiry**: Cognition and Computation, Philosophy and Cognition, Psychology and Cognition, Language and Cognition and Neuroscience and Cognition. Requirements



New Curriculum Beginning Fall 2020

Starting in Fall 2020, there are new requirements for the Cognitive Science Graduate Certificate. Certificate students must complete four classes, including:

- COGSCI 700, the new interdisciplinary Current Topics in Cognitive Science seminar class (available WN 2021)
- 3 additional classes from at least 2 different disciplinary Groups (**Cognition and Computation**; **Philosophy and Cognition**, **Psychology and Cognition**, **Language and Cognition**, and **Neuroscience and Cognition**)
