Getting started

Finding Funding

- Find <u>external funding</u> using <u>Pivot</u> and <u>Foundation Directory</u> with U-M credentials.
- Find <u>internal funding</u> using <u>Research Commons</u>. Check the Library's site for <u>undergraduate</u>, <u>graduate</u>, and <u>global experience</u> funding.
- Learn how to identify and prioritize the right funding opportunities for you using the <u>Finding Funding Masterclass</u>. Use your U-M credentials for access.

Writing & Editing a Proposal

- The <u>Sweetland Writing Center</u> provides <u>undergraduate</u> and <u>graduate</u> writing services, including for research proposals.
- Take a <u>persuasive grant writing course</u> to improve the quality of your proposals. Use your U-M credentials for access.
- Check sponsor websites for guidance on writing proposals. For example, <u>NSF</u> and <u>NIH</u> have writing guides. Review the specific grant solicitation and current guidelines.
