

He introduced the speaker, alumnus Steven R. Kalt, who has seen not only the world, but important changes within the scope of history studies over time. He pointed out that when he was a student at the University in the 1960s, the study of African and African-American history was virtually non-existent. His passion for travel and deep immersion in different cultures led him to study and visit 130 countries, particularly Africa. In 2001, he established the Kalt Fund for African-American and African History to provide important resources for History department activities, students, and scholars.

The rest of the day was devoted to recognizing the graduating seniors. Special recognition was given to the student editors who keep the *Michigan Journal of History* alive and well (Jenny Armstrong, Editor-in-Chief; Diane Hunt and Bryan Klausmeyer, Co-Editors). Professors Val Kivelson and Dario Gaggio took turns calling each graduate to the stage for a big round of applause and photo op to commemorate their academic accomplishments.


