Department Chair Geoff Eley welcomed the group and introduced the speaker, Robert J. Donia, who earned his Ph.D. in Balkan history from the department in 1976.

Dr. Donia and his wife Jane Ritter have been generous supporters and recently endowed the *Fred Cuny Professor in the History of International Human Rights* chair. Speaking to the new historians, he summed up why their background will be important to them as they move into the larger world.

"Only by understanding and appreciating history, can our nation achieve a healthy, vigorous public discourse that defines our values and allows us to carry out our responsibilities as citizens of the strongest nation on earth. Acquiring historical understanding, in other words, not only illuminates, it liberates....It is essential to defining our futures and achieving our destinies as individuals and as a nation. I am not arguing that knowing history leads inexorably to any single conclusion or policy; men and women with historical understanding will invariably come to quite different conclusions. But they will be conclusions based on sound values, considerable knowledge, respectful debate, and appropriate contemplation."





Graduating senior Michael F. Black was recognized for his work as co-editor of the *Michigan Journal of History*, a student-run publication of scholarly undergraduate historical work. He called on the editorial staff in the audience to stand and be recognized. The *MJH* is one example of what makes the department outstanding.



The main event of the day was seeing each of the graduates come to the stage for a well-deserved round of applause and a certificate. Professors Matt Lassiter and Farina Mir did the honors.
