


ANCIENT ROME

Explore and find artifacts from all around the Roman Empire. The answers and fun facts about each one are on the back.



Second Floor

All of the artifacts in the scavenger hunt can be found on the second floor of the Museum.



1. Centaurs draw the chariot of the god Dionysus, also called Bacchus, on this **sarcophagus**, which is a stone coffin typically adorned with a sculpture or inscription.
2. This Roman glass **perfume container** has four chambers to hold liquids.
3. This is a marble portrait **sculpture** of Polydeukion, a Greek youth who was the favorite pupil of the most powerful Athenian sophist of the 2nd century C.E. Herodes Atticus.
4. This **mosaic** comes from North Africa. The small square tiles that make the design are called tesserae. Can you guess how many pieces there are?
5. This is Eros, also known as Cupid, god of love. This portrait is part of our **Villa of the Mysteries murals**. In 1924, Francis W. Kelsey commissioned an Italian artist, Maria Barosso, to reproduce the wall murals of the Villa of the Mysteries in Pompeii, Italy.
6. These jars are called **amphoras**. The Romans used these transport vessels to ship wine and olive oil. These amphoras were found at the bottom of the sea.
