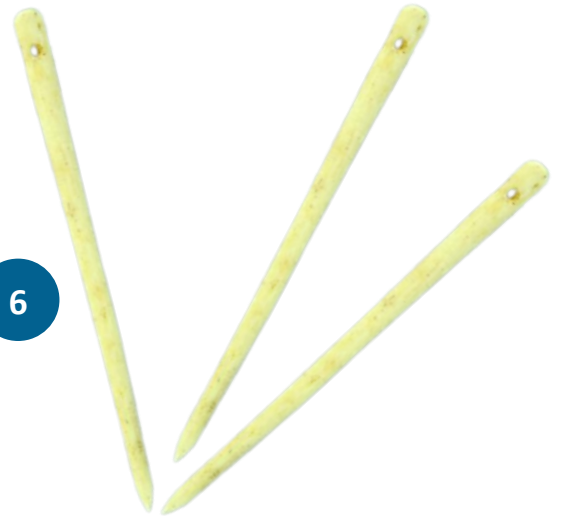

STINKY, NOISY, FUN: THE 5 SENSES OF THE ANCIENT MEDITERRANEAN

All the artifacts in the scavenger hunt can be found on both floors of the Museum.
Don't forget to look in the drawers!

1. Kylix depicts a musician holding a lyre, a popular stringed instrument. Vase paintings tell us a lot about Greek music culture and performance.
2. Greek fish plate! On this plate is where they would serve fish with a spot for sauce in the middle.
3. Egyptian collar necklace with amulets. Nice jewelry has always been easy on the eyes!
4. Wood Flute. Does this remind you of any instruments you've seen?
5. Glass perfume bottle. This Roman glass perfume container has four chambers to hold liquids.
6. Bone Needles. These needles are used to create textiles.
7. This Sarcophagus depicts multiple instruments being played. It highlights mixed performances, especially in funerary processions and rituals.
8. The Villa of Mysteries. These visually appealing walls provide a backdrop for Roman dining.
