 - d. RF2021.13 A Resolution to Propose to the LSA Student Body a Binding Ballot Question Regarding the Minimum Wage
 - i. Wojtara: Ask the student body about raising the minimum wage for student workers. The purpose is to get a feel on what the students think and based on the results that will inform our next steps as a government. The intention is to try to

pass this today. We have changed some wording from previous weeks.

- ii. Crespo: Thanks everyone who provided feedback. We want to hear more thoughts from campus because many students work and sometimes they're not able to pay their living expenses so it'd be helpful to hear students' interest.
 - 1. Vidhya-Ponraj: Can we add the current minimum wage into the question?
 - a. I would consider this friendly.
 - 2. Juliao: Put the current minimum wage to after hourly minimum wage ("..of \$12.00).
 - 3. Farah: Are we sure this is the official minimum wage? We have to make sure it's right?
 - a. Addison: Our boss in the dining halls said we get paid \$12/hour.
 - b. Wojtara: I haven't seen the number announced in writing but it seems to be the case.
 - 4. De Martinez: I don't know the new wage it's difficult to say. What about jobs that include tips?
 - 5. Farah: Crespo made a good comment. The average wage was \$12.hour. I don't think we should list anything if we can't find an accurate number.
 - 6. Juliao: As of 2020 \$9.50/hour for some jobs. Would the authors be amenable to not having the minimum wage listed as it's not up to date?
 - a. Wojtara: I'm okay with that.
 - 7. Addison: Rewording this ask "What do you think about current wages for jumps on campus?" I think that would give us a better understanding of where to head from there.
 - a. Vordonis: I think one of these options covers your concern. If choice A got a plurality, but didn't reach a majority do we have to act on it?
 - i. Crespo: We could still share the results with departments.
 - ii. Watt: The government is supposed to not act in opposition. We don't have to act in support.
 - 8. Juliao: Did you know this needs to be voted on tonight? This binding ballot question is in response to the Washtenaw County resolution that was drawn up and passed.
 - 9. Wojtara: You can find source 5 can see that the commissioners approved the \$15/hour.
 - 10. Addison: If this does pass, what are the action plans?
 - a. Wojtara: Have a resolution immediately following this once we see results, and then we'll go from there.



- 11. Farah: There is a group of student activists gearing up to fight for a higher minimum wage. If this does pass this would help them a lot.
 - a. Wojtara: That is a great way to get involved and that is something we could do.
- 12. Juliao: Changing workers to employees to match the answers?
 - a. Yes, that's friendly
- 13. Vidhya-Ponraj: In option C at the end "at all" seems redundant. Removing "at all"?
 - a. Yes, that's friendly
- 14. Addison: Can we omit \$15 and just say increase the wage?
 - Wojtara: I wouldn't say this as friendly. I think the \$15 figure is important. Based on the sources with living costs I think the \$15 minimum wage is a fair number.
 - b. Crespo: I will say that the \$15/hour will give us direction and accountability. We would have an objective goal. Activists are pushing \$15 and we should follow suit. Maybe add another option just stating the increase of the wage despite it being 15 or not.
 - i. Wojtara: I think choice B is a good option for this.
 - c. Addison: I'll retract it. The wording is pretty safe.
- 15. Lobodzinski: CSG is looking into doing a survey for a \$15/hour minimum wage on campus.
- 16. De Martinez: We have to keep in mind, with COVID, that wages are raising but wages will go back down after a while so this \$15/hour is important. So I think we need to specify the number.
- iii. Stoneman: Motion to call to question by placard vote
 - 1. Addison: second
 - a. Consented
 - 2. 21-0-1 (passed unanimously)
- e. <u>R F2021.14 A Resolution Condemning the Actions of Dr. Robert Anderson and the University of Michigan</u>
 - i. Farah: We intend on tabling for one week because we would like to talk to the survivors. We want to hear their experiences. Please look up this case and the scope of it. If you're interested in getting involved CSG has a tent in front of Schlissel's house so if you're interested please let me know. The support means a lot to the survivors.
 - 1. Vidhya-Ponraj: I do agree. Looking at the endorsers list, I feel like it's not very important to hear what they have to say in order to pass this resolution. I feel like this motion could be passed tonight.

- a. Farah: I would not be opposed to that. I would still like to hear from them next week.
- 2. Addison: Do we know of any other orgs on campus that have made a formal statement like this?
 - a. Yes, CSG. Other orgs have made statements. The University has made a few comments. I think there needs to be more.
- 3. Salino: On the last page, be it further resolved that speaks on the President's house. How important is it that we talk about the President's house?
 - a. I was not the author of those clauses. I know Mark Schlissel has another house. It seems like a waste it's a building that's sitting empty. I don't feel super strongly, but to stay in line with CSG I'd like to keep it in.
- 4. Vordonis: I didn't know a lot about this. Dr. Anderson and Bo is all over the place. In the last clause, does this include merchandise with them on it?
 - a. I don't know how the MDen is controlled. I think we're more concerned with the hall of fame and statues.
- 5. Watt: I noticed one of the changes was no longer calling for Elizabeth's resignation. Why was this removed?
 - a. Of the people on here, I felt her responsibility in this was a bit unclear. Wanted to give her the benefit of the doubt.
 - b. Watt: Do you think it'd be appropriate to delete the clause mentioning her?
 - i. Yeah

 - 1. They have a core program, a vice program, and SCAS. A lot of these are volunteer programs.
- iii. Bromberg: I probably could find the answer to the past speaker's question in a day.
- iv. Vordonis: Motion to vote by acclamation
 - 1. Seconded: Neff
 - a. Consented
 - b. Ayes win, this passes unanimously
- h. R F2021.12 A Resolution to Propose to the LSA Student Body a Binding Ballot Question Regarding the Renaming of Angell Hall (Old business)
 - i. Tam: This was introduced last week. Motion to suspend the rules and vote by straw poll by secret ballot.
 - 1. Watt: second
 - Vidhya-Ponraj: objection. Since there were changes to our question and people went to the meeting downstairs. Either debate or more information will help before the straw poll.
 Motion for sponsor to explain further
 - 2. Failed
 - ii. Tam: The purpose of the straw poll was the gauge interest. Currently CSG is working to introduce a resolution next Tuesday. If that passes then we will have a resolution here. We would have this introduced as a resolution calling for a change of name.
 - iii. Addison: Is the resolution for a binding question or is it to rename the hall?
 - 1. This would be a resolution for renaming for Angell Hall and Angell scholars
 - iv. Vidhya-Ponraj: Is the author's intent to have the ballot question and also introduce the resolution?
 - 1. Plan to table for one week and change resolution to call for renaming with no binding ballot question
 - v. Addison: Regarding this new resolution, is there any basis for their resolution? Is there student input?
 - 1. We're just interested in seeing this as a resolution.
 - vi. Farah: Recap.. LSA SG is the only government to have the opportunity to put this on the ballot. CSG is actively advocating for name change. If this is not passed,

the sponsors will rewrite the resolution to not include a binding question. After the teach in was there a unified stance that students came to in the end?

- 1. There was a good overview and it was quite complicated. There were a lot of different opinions. CSG still seemed intent on this resolution.
- 2. Nighwongers: There was consent that action needed to be taken, but not sure what that action should be.
- vii. Stoneman: I'm seeking clarity. It's my understanding that the authors have this impression that because there are mixed opinions that it's best to not put this to a vote? We would do something separate from this resolution and would go directly to taking a stance?
 - 1. Tam: Would the speaker like this to be voted on.
 - 2. I'm more frazzled than anything. Since there are mixed opinions, I think we should explore putting this to a vote. If it passes, we can gain access to student input that would be great and if it fails then we can introduce the resolution you were talking about.
- viii. Nighswonger: I think it would be beneficial to vote on this tonight.
- ix. Vidhya-Ponraj: Is debate necessary?
- x. Vordonis: I'm interested in engaging intent. If this passes and the student body voting no would you still consider pushing the resolution?
 - 1. If students vote no we can't act against it. We can't act against the wishes of the student body.
- xi. De Martinez: Why wouldn't we want this passed? I think tabling for a week is unnecessary. Why are some of us against this?
- xii. Ervin: How do we begin the debate process?
 - 1. Rothstein: friendly and unfriendly then debate
- xiii. Addison: The set up may bring up bias. Change the question to "thoughts on the naming of Angell Hall" "no thoughts at all" "the name carries negative..".

 Thoughts on name rather than what we're acting on.
 - 1. Unfriendly
- xiv. Ervin: Strike "the" between renaming and support?
 - 1. Yes friendly
- xv. Tam: If it's open ended, can it be binding?
 - 1. Watt: Ideally not open ended, but it could work.
- xvi. Addison: Propose the question to "Thoughts on the name of Angell Hall" and options that would best fit this question
 - 1. Vidhya-Ponraj: Motion to debate rather than trying to make this change in this current moment
- xvii. Vordonis: The resolution in its current form I believe it's not open ended. The fact that we're all debating goes to show how controversial this topic is. Making

it more open-ended would make it more questionable.
