**A Resolution Allocating Funds to Purchase Stickers Designating Left-Handed Desks**

*A bill for the consideration of the College of Literature, Science, and the Arts Student Government*

**Whereas**, the mission of the College of Literature, Science, and the Arts Student Government (hereafter LSA SG) is to “actively seek the voices of LSA students and advocate their interests to improve academic and non-academic life”;<sup>1</sup> and,

**Whereas**, 10% of the general population is left-handed, and about 10% of the desks in LSA lecture halls are left-handed;<sup>2</sup> and,

**Whereas**, there is often confusion regarding which desks are left-handed as they often can also serve as a right-handed desk; and,

**Whereas**, there is no clear identification of which desks are left-handed in the majority of LSA lecture halls; and,

**Whereas**, the use of stickers to identify left-handed desks would aid students who need this resource to be able to locate them, and for students who do not need them to allow students who do to utilize them; and,

**Whereas**, LSA Instructional Support Services (hereafter LSA ISS) has agreed to help print and post these stickers but needs assistance funding them.

**Be it therefore resolved**, LSA SG shall allocate \$100.00 to LSA ISS from the Academic Affairs Committee budget for the purchase of stickers to designate left-handed desks in lecture halls; and,

**Be it further resolved**, if for some reason the stickers fail to be printed, LSA SG shall retain the \$100.00 and it will carry over to the Fall 2017 budget.
