- Thesis Title: "The Nature of L'Esprit des lois."
- Summary: This thesis argues that the particular organization, composition, and errors of *L'Esprit des lois* made the text extremely ambiguous and useful to eighteenth century theorists and politicians, despite its intimidating length. It conformed quite well to the reading culture of the age, where its readers could read their present circumstances into the author's publication and make the text theirs, allowing *L'Esprit des lois* to be used across the ideological spectrum, cultures, and various schools of thought. Thus, what was constructed was something ambiguous where its readers continued to ask and answer what the author "really" meant, helping its popularity.
