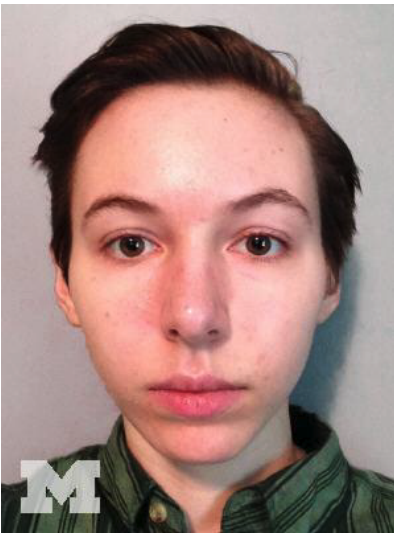




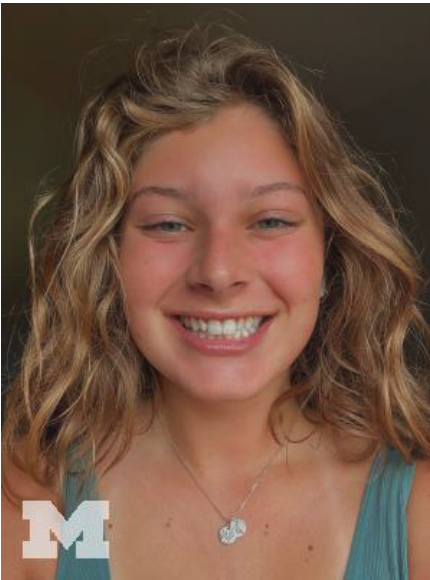
### **Senator Debbie Stabenow**
