A prime example is the Rhodes Scholarship, which provides full funding for two years of postgraduate study at the University of Oxford. ONSF applicants develop into self-aware leaders with the ability to craft specific plans to challenge the present and transform the future.

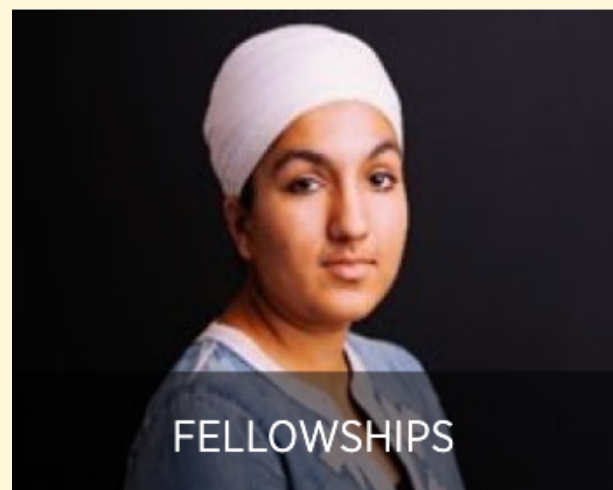
Working with ONSF

Our Programs

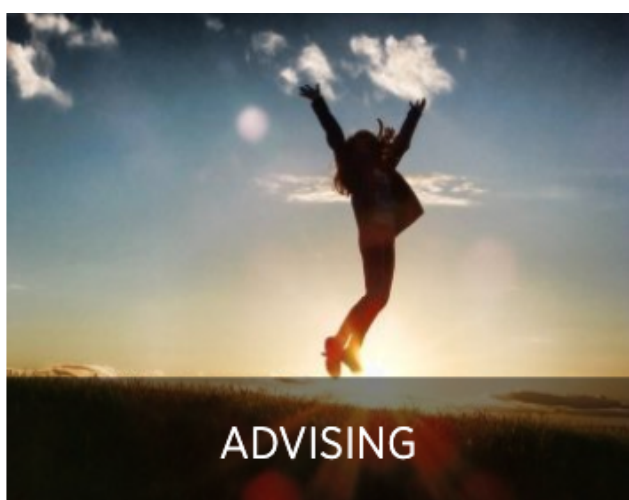
