

ORGANIZATIONAL STUDIES (OS) CURRICULUM WORKSHEET

Students must apply to the OS major. Admission occurs once per year, with an application deadline in mid-January (see OS website for application). OS is designed as a two-year program. Typically students apply in January of their sophomore year and start the program the following fall term.

The Core and Research requirements must be taken in certain terms: OS 305 and 310 in the first fall, and Research in the second fall term in the program. Thus, it is not possible to finish the OS Program in one academic year.

PREREQUISITES TO THE MAJOR

At the time of application to the major, it is preferred that all prerequisites be completed with grades showing.

At a minimum, to be eligible to apply, students must have completed two prereqs and be currently enrolled in the third.

 - 3 remaining courses (9 credits minimum) may be from any Cluster list (A, B or C)
- AND
- At least 2 Cluster courses must be **ORGSTUDY** 300/400 level courses, taken on AA campus, min 3 cr each
 - Only 2 200-level courses may be counted toward the Cluster requirements
 - Only 2 Cluster courses may be taken off the Ann Arbor campus
