

SOCIOLOGY UNDERGRADUATE FUNDING OPPORTUNITY REQUEST

The Sociology Department provides up to \$300 to support sociological academic experiences beyond the traditional U-M classroom (e.g. study abroad, research project, conference attendance, etc.)

- Student must be declared as a Sociology major, LISC minor, or SHM minor.
- Applications must be submitted *prior* to the start of the proposed academic experience by one of the following deadlines: October 1, December 1, February 1, and April 1. All applications received by these dates will be reviewed within three weeks of the deadline.
- Applications submitted electronically must be in PDF format (combined into a single document).
- Upon completion of the experience, student will submit a picture and complete a follow-up survey/questionnaire about the experience. Responses may be published on the department website.
- A student may receive this award a maximum of two times for two separate experiences.

Funding will be held until all requirements have been met. This registration includes the requirement to purchase health insurance while abroad.

All students receiving funding will be required, upon completion of the proposed academic experience, to submit a report to the Department of Sociology letting us know how it helped your development as a student and understanding of sociology. These reports will be used to inform the donors who help support the fund from which your scholarship is paid.
